

These drawstring bags are used to store sets of plastic caps which are used as math games / teaching aids for children in Tanzania, Africa. The finished bag, made of cotton or cotton/poly blend fabric, is 4-inch wide by 5-inch tall with a fabric drawstring closure.

- 1. Cut a 6.5-inch by 9-inch piece of cotton or cotton/polyester fabric.
- 2. Fold the fabric under 1/4-inch on the 9-inch side (see \mathbf{U} on the pattern) and press.
- 3. Fold the fabric under an additional 1-inch on the 9-inch side (see **2** on the pattern) and press.
- 4. Unfold the fabric and use a scissors to make a 1/2-inch cut on each 6.5-inch side of the fabric (see **B** on the pattern).
- 5. Refold the fabric on line $\mathbf{0}$ and then on line $\mathbf{2}$
- 6. Sew 1/8-inch from the edge of the fold $\mathbf{0}$ to form a casing for a drawstring.
- 7. Fold the fabric in half, right sides together (along the dotted line at ④ on the pattern).
- 8. Stitch the bag closed (along the dotted lines at **5** on the pattern) with a 1/2-inch seam, being sure to backstitch at each end of the stitching line for stitch security.
- 9. Turn the bag right-side out.
- 10. Cut a 14-inch piece of 1/2-inch wide bias tape for a drawstring.
- 11. Fold and press the bias tape in half lengthwise (to a 1/4-inch width).
- 12. Sew the bias tape drawstring together, along the length of the bias tape.
 - Alternatively, you can cut a 1-inch by 14-inch piece of fabric for the drawstring. Fold and press each long edge of the fabric under 1/4-inch, then fold and press the fabric piece in half lengthwise (to a 1/4inch width) and stitch closed long the length of the fabric.
 - Another option is to use three 18-inch long pieces of yarn, loosely braided with ends knotted together.
 - Please do not substitute satin ribbon for the drawstring. The ribbon is too slippery to keep the bag
- 13. Attach a safety pin on one end of a 14-inch long piece of drawstring fabric and guide the safety pin with fabric through the casing from one opening through to the other opening.
- 14. Tie the ends of the drawstring together with an overhand knot (the type of knot used to tie a balloon closed) with the knot right next to the openings of the casing.
- 15. Trim the ends of the drawstring to 1/2-inch.
